

#### President's Philatelic Page



Summer has finally arrived as we can tell by the attendance drop at our last couple of meetings, but please take a few minutes to come and enjoy the fellowship at the next meeting.

Stamp Collections- So far this year we have had 16 stamp collections either donated or we auctioned them to our members. From the amount of collections received it appears that no one wants to take up collecting stamps in those families.

In viewing these collections not all were given to our club, but the writer did have the opportunity to see some unique collections. The first one was a collection of 110 three rings binders and albums of stamps these we made a deal with a stamp dealer.

Then we get a call from a person that recently purchased an older home in rural Saskatchewan, in the attic he found six large boxes of stamps, no deal could be made as they thought a fortune was found. We noted stamps such as number 231 off paper, used two envelopes containing at least 2500 stamps, and many more low value stamps in this quantity – no value to anyone. Into the bedroom and here again wall to wall of boxes, bed covered no way anyone slept on it, other rooms in the house all packed the same. "When I asked the gentleman if I could have hauled t out in my SUV, I was told it would take 3-4 trips.

At time of writing I am still trying to confirm if the stamps were removed or not, the blaze appears on Face Book. That makes two houses of stamps within the last 6 months that had huge hordes of stamps, how many more are out there? Keep alert fellow philatelists, your dream may come through yet.

Editor's Comments: As we continue to celebrate our 50 years as a stamp club, it is a good time to look back at what we have done, where we are today and what is in store for us and for future generations. Each winter, we are one of approximately 43 exhibitors participating in the Saskatoon Heritage Festival. This is the only day of the year when there is free admission to the museum. Approximately 1500 people of all ages filled the Main street of Boomtown after a dramatic entrance by a talented bagpiper followed by eager children. Interactive activities included cow milking, face painting, and rope making. Our exhibit was in front of the museum's Post Office. It gave us an opportunity to promote our club, to display our philatelic collections about Saskatoon and Saskatchewan and to connect with people whom we may otherwise never meet. We also handed out over 400 free packets of stamps to the children who visited our exhibit table. Many adults asked about old collections they have, some wondered what their collections are worth or how to sell what they have. Some never realized there was a Stamp Club in Saskatoon. Stamp Club has been involved in this festival for several years and plans are to continue as we have no shortage of members who are willing to spend a day at the museum, talking about their hobby of stamp collecting.

We pass out stamp related quizzes, conduct auctions of club member items and also from donations of collections received by the club. We have a short business meeting at 8:00 PM, which is followed by a program which may be a speaker or member talking about parts of their stamp collection.

We have slide shows borrowed from the Royal Philatelic Society which are popular.


We produce club newsletters quarterly, and another way to become involved is to write articles for the club about stamps you collect.

## Canada's first "Individualized" Town Postmark - Love, SK S0J 1P0



Former Love postmaster, Pauline McKinnon and her husband came up with the idea of the teddy bear design. McKinnon says that they had piles of letters coming in that wanted a special postmark from Love. So, we thought it would be something to get the town on the map and it worked. However, no other village in Canada had an individualized postmark and it took McKinnon's husband five years to persuade Canada Post to approve it. In the first year more than 10,000 letters came through Love's post office, with letters as far away as Germany. Each year since, letters continue to pour in from places like the Netherlands,

Australia and Japan, to mention a few. Love is located 225 kilometers northeast of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. The Postmark was first unveiled on Valentine's Day, February 14, 1993.
